

Music for Miniatures brings the joy of professional classical music right to your doorstep, **creating special** moments for children aged 0-11 and their families within their own communities.

Our concerts are crafted with little ones in mind, but they do so much more than entertain. We're here to support your child's growth, boost your well-being as a parent, and help weave stronger community bonds.

When we visit schools, we're on a mission to enrich young lives. We're planting seeds of wonder, nurturing curiosity, and kindling a love for the arts that we hope will last a lifetime.



Our work falls into 3 strands:



Baby-friendly concerts

Our baby-friendly concerts cater to children aged 0-4 and their families, creating a supportive and relaxed environment for experiencing professional performances.

These concerts take place in various locations including Bristol, Bath, Wiltshire, Somerset, and Gloucestershire They provide an atmosphere where young children can engage with music naturally, without the usual constraints of formal concerts.

Our skilled professional musicians specialise in creating immersive and interactive musical experiences. They engage even the youngest audience members, fostering early appreciation for classical music.

Theatrical chamber music

Our theatrical chamber music shows blend classical music with storytelling and visual elements.

These multi-sensory performances make classical music more approachable and engaging for young audiences, sparking imagination and fostering appreciation for the art form.

Performances in schools

Our tours across the UK aim to enrich the musical experience of students and spark their interest in exploring music further.

Through these engaging visits, we hope to plant seeds of musical curiosity that may grow into lifelong passions.

Schools

Our school visits inspire both staff and students through engaging, interactive performances, bringing the excitement of live classical music directly into educational settings.

Projects

Monthly ticketed concerts

We **expanded our reach** to include Bristol as well as Bath for our monthly ticketed concerts. The new venue has been **hugely successful** and has enabled us to **benefit families further afield.** We continue to feature a wide range of instruments as well as an annual jazz concert and sell-out brass quintet Christmas concerts.

Mini tours during school holidays

A Musical Zoo toured to **4 venues** in October half term along with Bubble Bach. We developed a **new programme** for 0-4's, Under The Sea which was performed at **8 venues** in August reaching **60% new audiences**. We also developed another new show, The Owl & The Pussycat (aimed at ages 3-) which toured to **4 venues** during the summer.

Bubble Bach

Bubble Bach is a stunning combination of live music by JS Bach (performed oboe, violin and piano) and jawdropping bubble art. Our most popular show continued to wow audiences across the country. Developed in partnership with Mirabelle Arts, this "utterly breathtaking" performance has been touring since July 2020. Bookings come from schools, nurseries, and even day care centres and care homes for the elderly.

Pay What You Decide

Our Pay What You Decide concerts expanded to now include 9 areas of high deprivation enabling families to access live music with no financial barrier. We are hugely proud of our achievement and plan to continue this important project into 24/25. We have a separate impact report for this project. Please contact us if you'd like a copy.

Live music in schools

Live music in schools is so rare and we continue to be one of the very few providers offering concerts for schools. We visit schools across the country with our Bubble Bach show, Paddington's First Concert and a wide range of musicians to demonstrate their instruments and give interactive concerts that appeal to EYFS, KS1 and KS2.

The Snowman

This was the **fourth year** we've toured our Christmas Celebration. With permission from Snowman Enterprises Ltd we toured our small scale theatrical performance of Twas The Night Before Christmas and The Snowman. With 2 actors, puppets and piano the show **continues to delight audiences with "pure magic"** and in 23/24, we gave 22 performances at 6 schools and 6 public venues, reaching **over 1890 people.**

Inclusive and Accessible

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Music for Miniatures champions inclusivity, ensuring live classical music is accessible to EVERYONE. Our innovative Pay What You Decide concerts focus on areas facing economic challenges. Our performances reached communities across 9 areas of high deprivation – Twerton (Bath), Keynsham, Radstock, Trowbridge, Melksham, Chippenham, Hartcliffe (Bristol), Southmead (Bristol) and Barton Hill (Bristol) with multiple visits throughout the year. The initiative received an enthusiastic response, drawing sizeable and appreciative crowds. Notably, these concerts introduced 60% of attendees to their first live classical music experience, broadening cultural horizons in these communities

and child wellbeing.

Partnerships

We have developed a thriving partnership with **Tetbury Goods Shed** and **Valley Arts**, providing bi-monthly baby-friendly concerts for them in Tetbury and Chew Magna.

Our relationship with local professional chamber orchestra **The Bristol Ensemble** continues to grow. They provide musicians for some of our ticketed concerts in Bristol and we have multiple future collaborations in the pipeline.

We delivered performances on behalf of **Wiltshire Music Connect**, taking our high quality live classical music to schools across Wiltshire.

An exciting partnership for 24/25 is with **Bath Festivals** where we will work together to produce family concerts as well as broadening our reach to even more primary schools and 3 secondary schools.

Organisation development

The charity has continued to expand this year, increasing the hours of the Artistic Director, continuing to provide admin assistance, a freelance fundraiser and a marketing consultant whilst also being in a strong position to make strategic decisions about the next few years.

We continue to rely on ticket sales, donations and income from grant-making organisations to fund our work.

We strive to reduce our carbon footprint by using only local professional musicians and by taking our concerts out of the city centre to more communities where audiences can access our events by foot or bicycle.
